with individuals and organizations within the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis and beyond its boundaries.

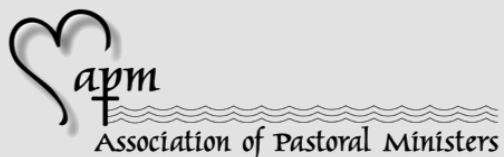
We are concerned with broader relationships and responsibilities.
